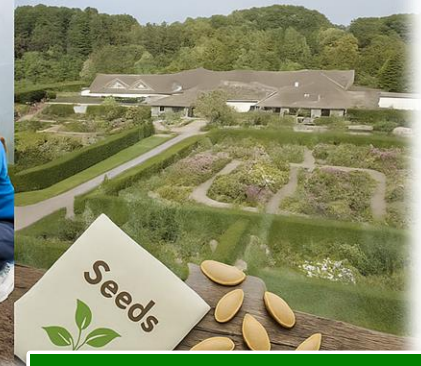

Led by experienced facilitators from Rap Therapy, the workshop encourages young people to reflect on their experiences, build confidence, and develop communication skills through creative writing and performance.

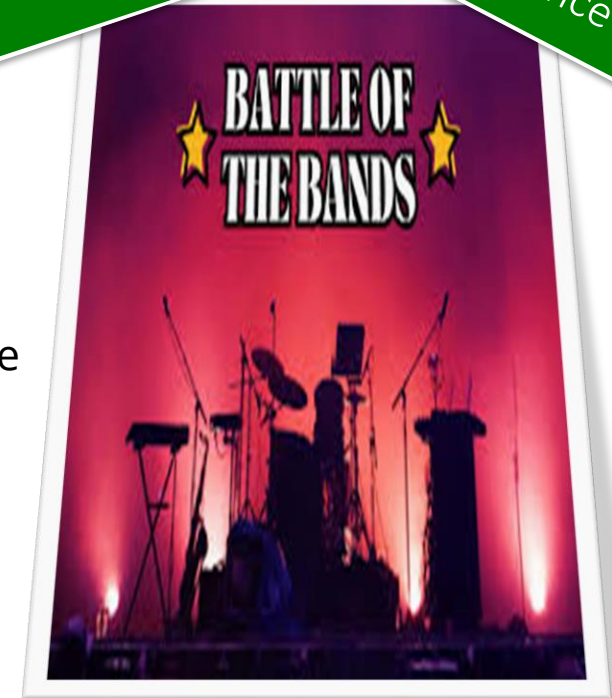
Students will then dive into the world of music production by forming bands, rehearsing, and putting on a show in the space of a week!

School based Activities- open to KS2, 3 and 4

Wildlife Week – Mrs Byrnes, Mr Park, Mr Kendall and Mr Hunter

During Wildlife week, students will immerse themselves in the great outdoors, taking part in Forest School based activities that focus on sustainability and protecting local habitats. Working in small groups, they'll learn how to build homes for wildlife – from bug hotels to bat houses while discovering how these structures support biodiversity in our school meadow and woodland areas.

Each day, students will rotate through a variety of outdoor learning experiences. These will include:

- Creating an ecology space in the meadow with Mr Park
- Forest school with Mrs Byrnes and Mr Hunter
- Pottery making with Mr Kendall - each student will create a finished item to take home once it has been in the kiln!

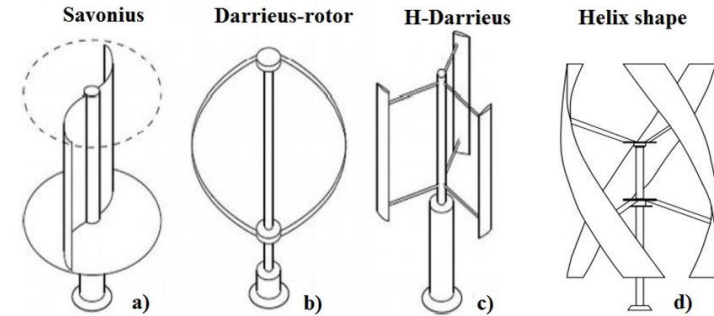
STEAM PROJECT – Mr Hasbury, Mr Wills, Mrs Pollington and Ms Darwish

During this STEAM-based project, students will explore how renewable energy can be both functional and beautiful. Working individually or in pairs, they'll design and build their own **vertical axis wind turbines (VAWTs)**, with a focus on how these structures can **blend into their environment** rather than stand out. Take part in a STEAM project

Each student will be given a **panoramic backdrop of a local site** and will create a windmill diorama that complements the landscape. They'll choose from four turbine designs and use materials like **copper wire, card, and papier-mâché** to bring their ideas to life. Students are encouraged to make their windmills colourful and creative, reflecting the local setting.

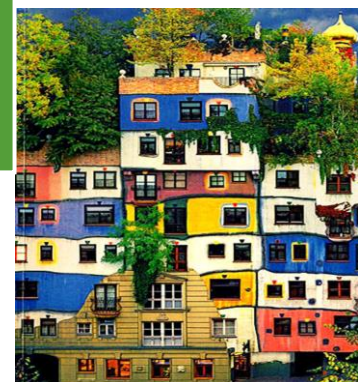
Throughout the week, students will:
